NON-PAPER PRESENTED BY THE DELEGATIONS OF AUSTRIA, CYPRUS, FINLAND,  
LIECHTENSTEIN, MALTA, SAN MARINO, SWEDEN, SWITZERLAND, YUGOSLAVIA

I. According to the mandate, the Preparatory Committee will devote its attention to dealing with the two main items:

- agenda, timetable and other organizational modalities of the CSCE Summit meeting, and
- recommendations regarding the conduct of the Summit including preparing a draft for its result.

Before the end of this session of the Preparatory Committee, agreement should be reached on the agenda and modalities of the CSCE Summit as well as on the main elements of one or more documents to be adopted by the Summit.

Agreement should also be reached at this session on the organization of the work of the Preparatory Committee including the setting up of appropriate informal working bodies. This working structure could be revised in the course of the work of the Preparatory Committee.

## II. ELEMENTS FOR ONE OR MORE SUMMIT DOCUMENTS

### Preamble

#### 1. Elements of a European peace order

- reaffirmation of the principles of the Final Act and their implementation
- commitments to the rule of law, pluralistic democracy and free elections
- commitment to economic co-operation based on the principles of market economy
- strengthening the role of the CSCE process

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- results of the negotiations on German unification.

#### 2. Efforts to strengthen security and co-operation in Europe

##### A. Military security

- endorsement of a document adopted at the CSCE negotiations
- taking note of the treaty concluded at the CFE negotiation
- addressing the continuation of these negotiations
- giving guidelines for future negotiations on military security including consultations on a mandate for negotiations between all participating States on confidence-building and disarmament

B. Human Dimension

- further efforts concerning the human dimension of the CSCE, including the development of the mechanism, taking into account the results of the Copenhagen Meeting
- convening of an expert meeting on national minorities

C. Co-operation in the field of economics, of science and technology and of the environment

- assistance to participating States which undertake profound reforms
- guidelines for the future role of the CSCE process, taking into account the results of the Bonn and Sofia Meetings

D. Strengthening of security and co-operation in the Mediterranean, taking into account the results of the Palma de Mallorca Meeting

E. Other topics

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3. Development of the structures of the CSCE process

- strengthening of political dialogue among the participating States through periodic meetings of Heads of State or Government, of Ministers of Foreign Affairs and of senior officials
- regular CSCE Follow-up meetings
- establishment of a small CSCE secretariat

- new structures in the field of security, including conflict prevention, crisis management and implementation of agreements on military security (exchange of information, communication, verification)
- guidelines for establishing a mechanism for the peaceful settlement of disputes
- creation of a parliamentary body for the CSCE
- relationship between the CSCE process and relevant international institutions, in particular the Council of Europe

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- concluding paragraphs

II. Time-table and other organizational modalities

1. The Summit Meeting will be convened on \_\_\_\_\_, 1990, at 10.30 a.m. in Paris. It will close on \_\_\_\_\_, 1990. The morning plenary sessions will be opened at 10.30 a.m., and the afternoon sessions will be opened at 3.00 p.m.
2. The Chair at the inaugural and closing sessions of the Summit Meeting shall be taken by a representative of the host country. The Chair at other plenary sessions shall be taken by High Representatives of the participating States on the basis of rotation in the following order: (established by lot)
3. The Secretary-General of the United Nations shall be invited to attend the inaugural session of the Summit Meeting as the Guest of Honour.
4. Agenda Items 1., 2., 3., 4. shall be considered in open plenaries.
5. Statements referred to in the Agenda Item 2., shall be made in open plenaries in the following order: (established by lot)
6. In accordance with paragraph 74 of the Final Recommendations of the Helsinki Consultations the Government of France designated the Executive Secretary of the Summit Meeting. This designation shall be approved by the participating States. The services of a technical secretariat will be provided by the host country.
7. Other rules of procedure, working methods and the scale of distribution of expenses of the CSCE will, *mutatis mutandis*, be applied to the Summit Meeting.
